Earl Linfred Gsell, "Lynn" of Lumberton, passed away on Wednesday, January 27, 2020 at Virtua Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 73.

Born in Mount Holly, the son of the late Robert & Evelyn Gsell, Lynn served his country in the US Navy during Vietnam, serving 2 tours of duty. He served 1 year on the USS Pluck. After returning to Mount Holly, he worked in the Title business, working as a Title Examiner for Settlers Title, but spent a lot of his working hours at the County Building in Mount Holly.

Lynn was a member of Chapter 899 of the Vietnam Vets, the Mount Holly Masonic Lodge and the Scottish Rite. He enjoyed fishing and spending time with his family.

He is survived by his wife of 46 years, Vickie; 2 sons: Jamison of Lumberton and Zachary (Danielle) of Mt. Holly; 2 grandsons: Jamison Lee & Jonas. He is also survived by his brother Robert Gsell, Jr., his sister Susan Gsell; sisters & brothers-in-law: Susan & John Marshall, Harold and Doris Garrison, Audrey Garrison; and nephews and nieces.
