Lawrence R. Corn of Hainesport passed away on Thursday, June 6, 2019 at Virtua Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 74.

Born in Sarasota, FL, Larry was a resident of Hainesport since 1951 and a graduate of Rancocas Valley Regional High School in Mount Holly where he played football. Larry served honorably in the US Army during Vietnam. He was a retired driver for Mount Holly Concrete Company.
