Theodore W. Holmes, Jr of The Villages, FL. died suddenly at his home on Friday, December 28, 2018. Born Christmas Day, 1943, to Theodore and Elizabeth (Betty) Holmes, he was 75 years old.

Born in Mount Holly, Teddy was a longtime Lumberton resident before moving to Florida. He and his wife of 41 years, Barbara (Hoffman), owned and operated Hy Way Garage, Inc. Through the years, Ted enjoyed fishing at the Jersey Shore, classic cars, Drag racing, traveling with his wife in their RV and camping with family and friends.
