William Downs, Jr., born and raised in Mount Holly, surrounded by his loving family, was called home on February 16, 2021, at the age of 77.

William was born on December 17, 1943 in Mount Holly to the late William and Myrtle (nee Gaunt) Downs. He was preceded in death by his brothers Joseph and Robert, Mother and Father-in-law Harry and Ida (nee Matarese) Danley, and brother-in-law Harry Danley. Bill was very proud to be able to coach both his sons in CYO baseball during the 70's and also loved playing fast-pitched softball in the Mount Holly League. Besides enjoying being with his grandchildren and great-granddaughters, Bill was an avid fisherman, being alongside his best fishing buddy "Captain Ray" on Ray's boat "Scuttlebutt." He also loved the beach for surf fishing and camping with his family. Golfing was another favorite activity alongside his golf buddy Harold Garrison. But most of all, he loved taking long drives and bus trip tours with his loving life partner and wife, Barbara. He loved his Philadelphia Sports Teams, but also favored the Yankees and the 49ers. Bill worked for Burlington Army Ammunition Plant, later to become a career truck driver working for Southland, where he received many driver's awards. Later in life, he finished his driving career working for Miller Ford.
