He is also survived by six grandchildren whom he adored: Andrea, Madelyn, Allison, Alexander, James, and Andrew; his sisters Judy and Anne; brothers-in-law Ronald, Allen, Michael, and Timothy; sisters-in-law Alana, Kate, and Deanna; and many nephews, nieces, cousins, and a multitude of friends and golfing buddies in NJ and FL. Al was predeceased by his parents, Alfred Robert, Sr. and Emily of Delanco, NJ.

Al, an Army National Guard veteran, was the retired owner of Advertising Design Systems, Inc. which he ran for 28 years. Prior to opening his own business, he was advertising manager at the Burlington County Times. He shared his love of life and good humor with everyone he met. He acquired many friends through his love of service: Samaritan Hospice board of directors, Rotary Mt. Holly Past President, Our Lady Queen of Peace, Sacred Heart Church, and Our Lady of Light Catholic Community choir member,
