Allen D. Scott passed away on Tuesday, August 04, 2009 after a brief battle with cancer. He was 57.

Allen was born in Bridgeton, NJ. He was a graduate of Rancocas Valley High School and Rutgers University. Allen served in the Defensive Intelligence Agency of the U.S. Army as Czechoslovakian linguist. He was employed by the State of New Jersey as a Parole Director until his retirement in 2004. Since that time, he found great fulfillment as a junior high substitute teacher. Allen was an outstanding athlete and earned varsity letters for baseball, football, and wrestling. He had a love for coaching and spent many years as a recreational soccer, basketball, and baseball coach for the Medford Lakes Athletic Association. Most recently, Allen coached the Neeta School junior high boys' basketball team. He was a soccer and basketball referee and volunteered on the board of the MLAA for which he was a past president. He also served as a past president of the South Jersey Men's Senior Baseball League.

Allen is survived by his wife Francine, loving children Brielle, Michael, Annie and Scott, mother Margaret, brothers Mark and Brian (Cindy) and nephews Brian and Kevin. He had one granddaughter, Nialoni. He was predeceased by his father, Allen.
