Arthur F. Woertz Jr. of Jobstown, NJ passed away suddenly at home on Wednesday, August 14, 2024 at the age of 75.

Arthur was born in Mount Holly, NJ in 1949 and was a longtime resident of the area. He graduated from Rancocas Valley High School Class of 1967. He served in the US Army, he was deployed to Vietnam from 1970 to 1971 and was part of the 2nd BN 94th Artillery. He also attended BCC and carried a Building Inspector HHS license.
