Bernard P. Patton of Springfield Twp. passed away Sunday, July 14, 2013 at his home. He was 76. Born in Reading, PA he was Veteran Paratrooper for the 82nd Airborne at the end of the Korean War and beginning of Vietnam. After the service, he worked as a Machinist for United Aero Products in Burlington and Stryker Machine in Trenton.

Bernard was a 40 year member of the North South Skirmish Assoc. serving as Deputy Commander of his team, Co. K 2nd NJ Cav., where he participated in Civil War Competitive shooting along with his son, brother-in-law, 2 sons-in-law, and grandsons. An avid and longtime Phillies and NASCAR fan; he also was a longtime member of the bowling leagues at Thunderbird Lanes in Wrightstown.
