Carroll E. Bickley, of Mount Laurel, passed away on Tuesday, January 8, 2019 at Virtua Hospital in Marlton. He was 90. He was born in Columbus, IN; the son of the late Clyde and Fairy (nee Thompson) Bickley.

Carroll served in the US Army and the Indiana State Guard. He received his Masters of Divinity from Baptist Theological Seminary. He was a pastor for many years and served at various churches. He was the pastor at First Baptist Church in Beverly and Memorial Baptist Church in Salem. After he retired as a pastor, he served as an interim pastor at many churches in the area including the First Baptist Church of Vincentown and the First Baptist Church of Cape May Court House. He also retired as a Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor for the State of NJ.

He is survived by his wife of 33 years, Phyllis (nee Weaver); children, Connie (George) Rigterink, Dave (Nina) Bickley, LouAnn (Tom) Culbert, Rob (Carolyn) Andrews, Pat (Bob) Rackinson, Debra (Rob) DiMeo; 9 Grandchildren; 15 Great-Grandchildren; and 1 Great-Great Grandchild; daughter-in-law, Betty Bickley; numerous nieces, nephews, and cousins.

He is predeceased by his son, Steve Bickley.
