Charles W. England Sr., 93, of Mount Holly, NJ, passed July 7, 2016. Born in Long Branch NJ, he was a lifelong resident of the State of New Jersey. A beloved husband and father, he met and married Mabel (Haffner) England in 1946 while serving our country. Together they had three sons, Charles Jr., Lawrence, and the late Randy; six grandchildren; and nine great grandchildren. Charles was a 1959 graduate of Monmouth College Nursing School and received his BA from Trenton State College in 1971. He worked for the State of New Jersey for 33 years, completing his career as a Psychiatric Nurse and Assistant Director of Trenton Psychiatric Hospital. Charles played trumpet, saxophone, and piano. He attended Juilliard School of Music for music composition and played as a sideman in NYC with some of the big band greats such as, Tommy Dorsey and Benny Goodman. He also loved amateur radio having built much of his own electronics and making contacts in well over 100 countries. He was active in the Burlington County and South Jersey Radio Clubs. A memorial service will be held at Brigadier General William C. Doyle National Cemetery in Wrightstown, NJ on July 19 at 1:00 pm.
