Charles W. Pike, of Myrtle Beach, formerly of Mt. Holly, NJ, loving father and grandfather, died Saturday, February 21, 2015 at Grand Strand Regional Medical Center in Myrtle Beach, SC. He was 81.

Born in Mt. Holly, New Jersey on June 17, 1933, he was a son of the late Alice and Harry Pike Sr. He was preceded in death by his brothers Harry Pike Jr and George Pike, a niece, Barbara Pike and his "lady friend" Julia Leming. He is survived by his only son Joseph Pike (Karen), and his granddaughter, Jade Pike, all of Myrtle Beach, SC; two nieces and two nephews.

He was a thirty year plus employee of the Burlington County Highway Dept. and farmed with his father, brothers and nephews. He attended Mt. Holly High School and was an ex Fire Chief of the Eastampton Township Fire Dept.

During his service as a firefighter, he became a Life Member of the NJ State Firemen's Association and attended its annual conventions for over 30 consecutive years. He loved automobile racing, owned a TQ Midget race car and loved hunting and fishing.
