April 12, 1942 - September 2, 2018

Charles D. Schenck, of Westampton, passed away on Sunday, September 2, 2018 at the Acuity Specialty Hospital of Southern New Jersey. He was 76. He was born in Norristown, PA; the son of the late Charles and Elizabeth (nee Marlin) Schenck.

Charles D. Schenck served his country for 52 years. 20 years on active duty in the army as a helicopter pilot, with two tours in Vietnam saving many lives flying as a DUSTOFF medivac pilot. He was a highly decorated Vietnam Veteran, having received the Silver Star and many other medals and accommodations. He earned his Master Degree from the University of Southern California in International Relations. He retired honorably from active duty in 1982 and then started his second career in Civil Service as a Safety Manager, serving 14 years in Germany at various bases and the last 18 years with the 99th Regional Support Command at Ft Dix, NJ. Upon his second retirement he was presented and honored with the Superior Civilian Service Award in 2014.

Charles is survived by his wife of 46 years, Maria (nee Wagner); daughters, Christine Rodamer and Michelle Schenck; sister, Kathleen Schenck; sister-in-law, Susanne Scheufens and family of Germany; brother-in-law, Hans Wagner and family of Germany; cousins, Michael Marlin and family, Tina Marlin Mathe and family, and Patricia Haberle and family. In addition to his parents, Charles

is predeceased by his parents-in-law, Georg and Susanne Wagner, his favorite aunts, Kitty and Peggy, and cousin, Mary Marlin.

Relatives and friends may attend his visitation on Saturday, September 8 from 10:30-12 PM at Perinchief Chapels, 438 High St., Mt. Holly. A memorial service will follow at 12 PM at the funeral home.
