Charles Vanartsdalen of Marlton passed away on Tuesday, January 16, 2018 at the Samaritan Hospice Inpatient Unit in Voorhees. He was 83.

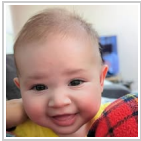
