Clarence R. Stevenson of Pemberton passed away on Monday, January 26, 2014 at Virtua Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 73 years of age.

Born and raised in Mount Holly, he was a lifelong area resident. He was a US Navy Veteran and served during Vietnam. After his honorable discharge, he later opened his own business in 1970, the South Jersey Professional School of Business, in West Berlin and subsequently Marlton, where he found his true calling as an insurance pre-licensing instructor, greatly impacting many lives. In his spare time he was an avid fisherman and loved going to the horse track.

Clarence is survived by his wife of 49 years, Dale (Grooms); 2 children: Mark R.
