After a short but hard fought battle with cancer, Clarence Homer Watson passed away on February 21, 2018 in Stratford, NJ at the age of 81.

Clarence was born on August 15, 1936 in Philadelphia, PA to parents Julia and Clarence Watson. He had an enormous love for music that he carried with him for his entire life as well as a tremendous work effort. He graduated from The University of the Arts in 1958 with a degree in music theory with a concentration in trombone and where he also was a member of the orchestra, stage band and brass ensemble under the direction of Charles Gusikoff.

Clarence was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1959 and served for two years and played in the U.S. Army Band. Following his discharge in 1961, Clarence began teaching within the Pemberton Township school system where he

taught music for 38 years until his retirement in 1999. He never fully retired, however, and continued to teach lessons at the N.J. School of Music all the way up until the time that he fell ill.

Through his passion for music and dedication to his craft, Clarence was fortunate enough to also be a professional musician from the age of 17. He had the opportunity to perform with Sammy Davis Jr., Frank Sinatra, Lionel Hampton, Marvin Gaye, Elvis Presley, The Temptations along with many others at the Latin Casino, Atlantic City casinos and other venues across the nation.

Clarence is survived by his wife Jeana Watson; his sons, Michael and Tristan Watson; his sister Elaine; his niece Tiffany; his nephew Marek and his daughter-in-law Donna Watson. He is preceded in death by his mother-in law and father-in-law, Jean and Milton Dace.
