David W. Croshaw of Columbus passed away on Wednesday, April 27 at the Samaritan Hospice Inpatient Unit in Mount Holly. He was 69.

Born in Mount Holly, the son of the late Ryland & Ethel Croshaw, David was a graduate of Northern Burlington High School and the University of Findlay in Ohio. He was the longtime owner of Croshaw Nursery in Columbus where he worked as a tree farmer and nurseryman. David was a member and former director of the New Jersey Christmas Tree Growers Association, a member of the Burlington County Board of Agriculture, and a member of the Mansfield Township Environmental Commission.

He is survived by his wife of 42 years, Sandra; a son Jeffrey of Columbus; and a daughter Heather of St. Croix.
