David M. Phoebus "Mikey" of Eastampton, passed away on Wednesday, March 18, 2015 surrounded by his family at his daughter's home in Tabernacle. He was 85.

Born in Baltimore, MD, Mr. Phoebus was a lifelong area resident. Dave resided in Eastampton for more than 60 years in the home he built and shared with his wife and their children. He was a US Army Veteran and a custom home builder and general contractor. He worked in partnership with Isgro & Phoebus, then Lippincott & Phoebus, and his last business was David M. Phoebus, General Contractor. Dave was a longtime member of the "Esquire Diner Breakfast Buddy Club" where he enjoyed spending time with his friends solving the world's problems.
