Dorothy A. "Dewey" Rockwell of Mount Holly died Monday, April 12, 2010 at Virtua-Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. She was 69.

Born in Mount Holly, Dewey was a lifelong Mount Holly resident. She was a member of Rancocas Valley High School class of 1958. Dewey was a retired Court Clerk for the NJ Superior Court. She had also worked for NJ Bell, the Mt. Holly Diner, as a volunteer Court Mediator, and for Tranquility Spa and Tanning.
