May 28, 1939 - March 14, 2015

Edward T. Brennan of Lumberton passed away on Saturday, March 14, 2015 at his residence, surrounded by his family. He was 75.

Born in Camden, Mr. Brennan was a lifelong resident of Lumberton, US Army Veteran of Vietnam, and then worked at US Pipe and Foundry for over 50 years, retiring when they closed the plant. He was a longtime member and road captain of the Blue Knight Int'l Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club, NJ 1. Mr. Brennan was a graduate of Rancocas Valley Regional High School and was a member of the Future Farmers of America while in High School.

He is survived by his wife of almost 50 years, Ronnie; a daughter Frances (Rodney) Stayton of Lumberton; a son Edward T., Jr. of Mt. Holly; 3 grandchildren: Victoria, Ryan, & Gabrielle. He is also survived by 2 brothers: Dallas of Lumberton & Jack of Southampton. He was the brother of the late Patricia Greenwald & Michael Brennan.
