Edward "Ed" Baldinger, Sr., of Eastampton, entered into eternal peace on Wednesday, January 19, 2022 at his home surrounded by his family. He was 82. Ed was born and raised in Pittsburgh, PA; the son of the late Albert and Sara Dickson and husband of the late Margery Baldinger.

Ed served in the US Marines followed by a career of public service with the Westampton Police Department. He also was a member of the Rancocas Fire Department and Emergency Squad, Beverly Emergency Squad, American Legion 509, Amvets Post 79 and Mt. Holly Elks. He also previously served as director of Westampton OEM services and a former Firearms Instructor for the Burlington County Police Academy. Ed's passions included spending time with his family, supporting Veterans, and watching sports. He was a life long fan of the Pittsburgh Steelers.
