



Edward "Chubs" Hazynski

August 24, 1923 - October 20, 2010

Edward J. "Chubs" Hazynski of Hainesport died Wednesday, October 20, 2010 at his residence. He was 87.

Born in Philadelphia, PA, Mr. Hazynski was a US Navy Veteran and served on the U.S.S Wisconsin during her entire first cruise April 16, 1944 thru October 15, 1945. He later worked and retired from Hercules as a pipe fitter. He was a member of Our Lady Queen of Peace Church in Hainesport.

"Chubs" was most known for his service to the Hainesport Community. He was a Charter Member and First Captain of the Hainesport Emergency Squad. He served 14 years as Squad Captain earning the title of Captain Emeritus. He also served 13 years as Squad President. He responded to more ambulance calls than anyone in the Squads history as had remained an active crew member for over 50 years.

He was also an active member of the Hainesport Fire Company between 1947 and 1990. "Chubs" was a Past President and Past Engineer of the fire company.

Mr. Hazynski was a First Aid and CPR Instructor for many years for Hainesport and other local squads. He was past Director of the Burlington County First Aid Academy. "Chubs" was also an instructor or numerous police academies around the state in CPR and Crash Injury Management and was an evaluator for Emergency Medical Technician courses throughout New Jersey. He received a "Lifetime Achievement Award" in January 2007 for Burlington County Emergency Service Personnel.

The son of the late Victoria and Konstanty Hazynski and the brother of the late Stella Kelestyn, Michael Hazynski, and Violet Mozgo; he is survived by his sister Bertha Harris of Eastampton and many nieces and nephews.

Mass of Christian burial will be celebrated on Monday at 10:30 AM at Our Lady Queen of Peace Church, 1603 Marne Highway, Hainesport, NJ.

Interment will follow in Sacred Heart Cemetery. Friends may call on Sunday evening from 6-9 PM at the Perinchief Chapels, 438 High St., Mt. Holly.
