Elizabeth (Betty) Lovelett passed away March 12, 2009 at Virtua Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. She was 82.

Betty was born in New York City, raised in White Plains, NY before moving to Burlington County and settling in Mount Holly. She was a resident of Mount Holly since 1954.

Betty is survived by her husband of 58 years Bill of Mount Holly, four children; Anne Stoppe of Fairfax, VA and husband Ben, Roger of Charlotte, NC and wife Debbie, Lynn Elizondo of Mason, Ohio and Paul of Charlotte, NC and wife Susie, and three grandchildren; Jonathan and William Lovelett of Charlotte, NC and Melissa Elizondo of Mason, Ohio. Betty graduated from White Plains High School, White Plains Hospital Nursing School and Trenton State College. She was an Army Nurse Cadet while in nursing school and would have been commissioned in the Army Nurse Corp had World War II continued. After becoming a Registered Nurse she worked in various nursing disciplines before becoming a school nurse and eventually a school social worker. She retired in 1987 as the School Social Worker for the New Egypt Township Schools.

Betty was a Girl Scout leader for many years, an avid card player in two local card clubs, civic volunteer on several Mount Holly Township committees and fifty plus year member of the Mount Holly Women's League. In her retirement years she split her time between her homes in Mt. Holly and San Benito, TX. She enjoyed traveling throughout the United States and Europe.
