



## Eugene E. Kline Jr.

April 16, 1943 - August 8, 2009

Eugene Kline of Mount Holly died Saturday August 8th ,2009 at J. F. Kennedy Hospital in Cherry Hill. He was 66. Gene was born in Lewenberg, NC, the son of the late Eugene and Edna Kline Sr. and lived most of his life in Mount Holly. He was a 1961 graduate of Rancocas Valley Regional High School and a 1965 graduate of Glassboro College. Gene returned to Rancocas Valley and taught Art at the high school for 38 years. He was an assistant football, wrestling and track coach for 36 of those years. Mr. Kline was a member of the RVEA, NJEA and also NJSIAA and a member of Mount Holly Elks Lodge #848.

Mr. Kline is survived by his wife Kathleen (Kathy), three sons: Eugene III and Sean, both of Mount Holly and Scott of Orlando ,FL. Also surviving is a granddaughter, Grace, a sister-in-law Cindy Woods and her husband Tony of Philadelphia and a brother-in-law Wayne Evans also of Philadelphia.

Funeral Services will be held Friday at 11AM at the Perinchief Chapels, 438 High Street, Mount Holly. Interment will be private.
