Evelyn Ruth (nee Jones) Fletcher of Mount Laurel passed away peacefully at her home, surrounded by her family on Tuesday, February 23, 2016. She was 85.

Born in Mount Holly, she was the daughter of Henry Jones, Sr. and Emeline Mary (nee Kimble) Jones. Evelyn was a lifelong area resident. She was a retired Registered Nurse who graduated from Cooper Nursing School in Camden, NJ. She had worked for several local hospitals and doctor's offices.

She was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Mount Holly. She was a choir member at the church, a Christian Neighbors member, a softball coach, a Girl Scout leader, and a leader for the Pioneer Girls. She also was a member of a quilting club. Mrs. Fletcher was a member of the Mount Laurel Historical Society and the Chairman for July 4th Committee for Mount Laurel.

Mrs. Fletcher is survived by her husband of 63 years, Robert; 3 children: David W. Fletcher of Woodlynne, NJ, Diane S. Armstrong of Medford, NJ, and Beth A. She is also survived by her brothers Henry Jones, Jr. and Curtis Jones.
