Francesco Colombo, of Eastampton, passed away on April 6, 2026. He was 93 years old.

Son of the late Salvatore and Orazia Colombo, Francesco was born on March 9, 1933, and raised in Pozzallo, Sicily, Italy. Francesco immigrated to the United States in 1946 at the age of 13 with his family and settled in Brooklyn, NY. In 1956, Francesco married his beloved wife Maria and eventually settled in Eastampton, NJ. Francesco worked as a research chemist and was a member of the American Chemical Society and the Chemical Specialties Manufacturers Association. During his career as a research chemist, he developed multiple patents in his name. Francesco also enjoyed gardening and baking, but above all Francesco was dedicated to his family.

Francesco is predeceased by his beloved wife of 69 years Maria Colombo, and his brother Carmello Colombo.
