



## Frederick August Mahn

April 24, 1930 - November 11, 2010

Frederick A. Mahn of Mount Holly died Thursday, November 11, 2010 at Virtua-Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 80.

Born in New Brunswick, NJ, and a graduate of North Plainfield High School and Rutgers University, Mr. Mahn was a longtime area resident. He was a US Army Veteran of Korea where he served as a 2nd Lt from 1951-1953. Mr. Mahn was a retired Soil Conservationist with the US Department of Agriculture where he worked for 31 years. In 1974, he received the Award for Outstanding Service as a professional conservationist by the NJ Association of Natural Resource Districts. He also was a farmer and was co-owner of Jersey Devil Cranberries, and North Branch Blueberries. He was a longtime member of the First Presbyterian Church in Mount Holly.

He is survived by his wife Joyce; a son Frederick, and a daughter Carol Mahn. He is also survived by a granddaughter, Gerri; and a brother Walter of Hawaii.

Funeral Services will be held on Thursday at 11:00 AM at the First Presbyterian Church, 125 Garden St., Mount Holly. Interment will follow in Bloomsbury Cemetery.
