Harley Earl Rockhill of Riverside, formerly of Moorestown, died Friday, April 16, 2010 at Cooper Hospital in Camden. He was 78. Born in Mount Laurel and a longtime Moorestown resident, Harley was a self-employed contractor/remodeler. He was the youngest of 13 children.

Both of our fathers did hard , back breaking , grueling work - and to my eyes their work schedule did not seem to ever slow down.

Harley and my dad worked on many of the old, historic homes in and around Moorestown.

Despite the cold winters or sweltering hot summers - they worked to support their children and to keep the heat on and food in the kitchen.

*As you might expect , having two Rockhill families attending the same Moorestown public schools - was confusing to some .
(for many years the teachers would have at least one Rockhill student in the classroom)*

People in town would ask me if I was one of the Linden street Rockhills - I would say no, I'm one of the 8 Rockhill kids from Church street .

Sometimes after school before my dad came home from his long work day - I would walk home from the Allen Middle school to stop by at Uncle Harley's house.

Many times I just hung around - to see Ricky or Timmy or Brenda on occasion, many days to see Aunt Sue in the kitchen.

On some afternoons, I would stay until dinner time and Harley would have me sit down in the kitchen and join them while eating oven baked turkey pot pies or what ever meal they were serving. They always had home made ice tea cold in the fridge.

Yes Harley could be funny at times, whether in town or out at the Rockhill potato farm in Lumberton each Summer.

My two kids do have a picture with Harley taken in July 2008 while up at Aunt Joan's family reunion.

Sorry I could not attend the service, Harley was in my thoughts this week and shall be remembered.
