Harold A. Farrell, Sr., of Browns Mills passed away Saturday, March 28 at Samaritan Hospice in Mt. Holly. He was 83.

Harold was born in Brooklyn, NY and grew up in the Hammonton and later lived in Blackwood. He was a resident of Browns Mills since 1985.

Harold served in the Merchant Marines and the US Air Force during the Korean War. He worked as the engineer in charge for Kennedy Health System in Cherry Hill and after retirement returned to work part time at Hunters Glenn Apartments in Delran.

He was a member of the American Legion, loved coaching Little League baseball, loved New Year's Eve and prided himself on being a good Dad.
