Harold F. Yoos of Mt. Holly went to be with the Lord on May 16, 2018. He was 87.

He was born and raised in Mt. Holly. After graduating from Mt. Holly High School he enrolled in the Philadelphia Museum School of Art (University of the Arts) and graduated with a BFA in Industrial Design. Upon his graduation he enlisted in the U.S. Armed Services in the 76th Tank Battalion, Fort Campbell, Kentucky. After his Honorable Discharge he began his career as an Industrial Designer with RCA. During his career he worked for Philco-Ford Corporation, Westinghouse Electric Corporation and back at RCA/Lockhead Martin. in Moorestown, NJ.

Harold was a lifelong member of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, serving as usher, Sunday School Teacher and served on many church committees. He was active in the Mt. Holly Indian Guides with his two sons and with Indian Princess' with his youngest daughter. He was also active in the St. Paul's Men's Prayer Breakfast, the Mt. Holly's Lions Club, Mt. Holly Historical Society and past Board Member of Westwood Swim Club.

While employed at Westinghouse, he and two fellow associates invented, filed and were issued a U.S. Patent for a Rechargeable Device. During his career he received many awards and honors. He was the recipient of the AEGIS Technical Excellence Award and author of several technical publications. Harold was an extremely talented artist and he also enjoyed building and working on his model trains at home and tend to his vegetable garden and

yard and traveling the world with his beloved wife.

Harold is the beloved husband of the late Viennesia (Carroll). He was a devoted father to Leslie Augustino (John), Mark Yoos (Veronica), Dana Yoos (Jody) and Alyson Kelly (Tom). He was the adored grandfather to Christopher Yoos, Matthew Augustino, Thomas Weiss, Kristen Weiss, Dylan Yoos, Sarah Yoos, and Jack Kelly. He was also the very proud great-grandfather of Shipley and Ritten Yoos. He is survived by his sister Elizabeth Polidora, sister-in-law Roberta Yoos, brother-in-law's Richard Carroll, David Carroll and wife Carol, and sister-in-law Patricia Maddalena, and Bonnie Carroll, along with many nieces, nephews and cousins and his dearly devoted health aides Hilda Davis and Alice McConnell.
