



Harold "Hank" Stevenson

July 17, 1924 - October 31, 2010

Harold "Hank" Stevenson of Southampton Twp. died Sunday October 31st at Virtua Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 86. Hank was born in Chatsworth, the son of the late Harold and Eva Adams Stevenson. When he was a young man, he and Walter Brower were the first people to arrive at the "Blue Comet" train that derailed in the Pine Barrens. Following High School Mr. Stevenson joined the Army and served in the European theatre with the 113th Cavalry Recon Squadron and was awarded the Silver Star Medal . For over 25 years he was a mechanic and in the maintenance Dept. at the New Lisbon State School. Mr. Stevenson was a member of Central Lodge F & AM in Vincentown and Mt. Moriah Lodge F & AM in Bordentown. He was an avid hunter and fisherman and was an award winning trap shooter, being named a member of the Eastern States Hall of Fame, and also had membership in the Trap Shooting "Cavaliers". He was a member and seven time president of the Pine Belt Sportsman's Club. Mr. Stevenson was a longtime, active and faithful member of Grace Episcopal Church in Pemberton.

Mr. Stevenson is survived by his wife of 51 years (on October 26th)Ruth, children George, Edward, Kim and Shawn; 5 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. He is also survived by a brother, George Stevenson of Southampton and a sister Vera Topham of Chatsworth.

Burial Office will be celebrated Friday at 11AM at Grace Episcopal Church, 43 Elizabeth Street, Pemberton. Interment will be in Chatsworth Cemetery.
