Harry W. George, Jr. of Burlington Township, passed away on Monday, October 7, 2019 at the Samaritan Hospice in Mount Holly. He was 82.

Born in Camden, NJ, Harry grew up in Columbus and was a graduate of Berea College in Berea, Kentucky. He went on to earn Masters Degrees from Trenton State College and Widener University. Harry was a longtime Business Education Teacher at Rancocas Valley Regional High School from 1965-1990. He also had his own tax practice and was a Certified Financial Planner. Harry was a former member of Mount Holly Elks, the Mount Holly Lions Club, and the Rotary Club in Bordentown. He enjoyed walking, jogging and had finished several marathons. Harry liked to work in the yard and was a helpful neighbor who enjoyed telling jokes and drinking WaWa coffee.

Harry is survived by his wife of 58 years, Mary Lu George; a daughter Bonnie Knorr and her husband John of Westampton; a son Wayne George of Delran; and a granddaughter Erin. The brother of the late Albert & Donald, he is also survived by several nieces and nephews.

Funeral Services will be held on Saturday at 11:00 AM at the First Presbyterian Church, 125 Garden St., Mount Holly. Burial will be in the Columbus Cemetery. Friends may visit with the family on Saturday from 10-11 AM at the Church. Contributions in Harry's memory may be made to the
