Hugh J. McGee III of Lumberton died Wednesday, July 4, 2012, at Virtua Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 64.

Mr. McGee was born in Philadelphia, the son of Helen Lee McGee and the late Hugh McGee II.

He was an U.S. Army veteran of Vietnam.
