James E. Patrick, a 57-year resident of Lumberton, passed away Wednesday, July 6, 2011 at Care One Moorestown. He was 87.

Born and raised mostly in the Frankford section of Philadelphia, Jim attended Philadelphia Parochial Schools prior to entering the U. S. Army.

He served his country honorably during World War II serving as a rifleman in the 422nd Infantry, 106th Division. Jim was captured by the Germans during the Battle of the Bulge and was held prisoner in various mining, farming and other work camps.

Jim worked as a printing pressman most of his working career. He also worked in construction trades, machine shops and the automotive industry at times.

He was a member of the American Ex-Prisoners of War Neglected Heroes Chapter. Jim was also an accomplished wood worker who would carve duck decoys and construct fully-rigged sailing ship models from scrap wood.

He is survived by his devoted wife of nearly 65 years, Helen L. (Montgomery), their only son Donald J. Patrick and his wife, Gretchen, of Mount Laurel, grandchildren Shannon L. Patrick of Mount Pleasant, SC and Tyler D. Patrick

of Mount Laurel and a brother, Stephen J. Patrick and his wife Gladys of Cinnaminson.
