



Jean Lee Moore

November 18, 1919 - April 14, 2014

Jean Lee Moore, 94, passed away at her home in Mt. Holly on Monday, April 14, 2014, after a life well lived. A lifetime Burlington County resident, she graduated from Mt. Holly High School in 1937, and went to work for the YMCA, the Navy Department during World War II, served as the Director of the Visiting Homemaker Service of Burlington County and finally worked for the Burlington County Health Department until her retirement in 1993.

Tireless in service to her community, she served on the PTA of Sacred Heart School, the Mt. Holly Childrens Home Board, the Mt. Holly Historical Society, and the committees for the Mt. Holly celebrations of the National Bi-Centennial and the township Tri-Centennial in 1977. She was a faithful member of Sacred Heart Church and she was particularly devoted to her work with the Female Benevolent Association of Mt. Holly, a group founded in 1814 to help relieve the sufferings of the working poor.

Jean leaves a legacy of love and kindness. She loved to travel, visiting friends and family and enjoying tours of Europe and the USA. She loved to communicate through cards and phone calls. She never forgot her roots as part of the Lee family in Chatsworth. She particularly loved bringing friends to see the colorful cranberry Harvest in the Pines in the Fall. Sharing in the famous Lee reputation for hospitality she delighted in furnishing her historic home with antiques (especially found bargains) and entertaining family and friends there. She was famous for her mac and cheese. Always regretting the fact that she could not attend college herself, she and her husband worked to ensure that their four children would achieve college and advanced degrees and then in turn, never "let up" on the next generation. For this reason, there is a scholarship to Burlington County College awarded to a graduate of Rancocas Valley H.S. each year in her and her late husband's name by their children.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Anna and Stephen V. Lee, her sisters Mary Lee Madden, Sarita Lee Roberts, Ann Lee Jackson, and her brothers John Lee and Stephen V. Lee, Jr., sisters in law Susanna Hickman and Mary DeMott and her beloved

husband of 61 years Stacy L. Moore, Sr. She is survived by her son, Stacy L. Moore, Jr. (Anne), and her daughters Nanci Lee Moore, Mary Jane Kiefer (Michael) and Sarita Laughlin (John), her six grandchildren Maureen C. Moore, Stacy L. Moore, III, David Kiefer (Delilah), Christine Kiefer Dietrich, (Jason), John Laughlin and Robert Laughlin, three great grandsons Benjamin and Erik Kiefer and Jakob Dietrich, her brother in law Lorenz P. Moore, her sisters-in law, Katherine Moore Seitz and Elizabeth Moore Miller, and many cousins, nieces, nephews, and great nieces and nephews on both sides of her family, and many, many friends.

The family will receive visitors at the Perinchief Chapels, 438 High Street, Mt. Holly, on Thursday, April 24th from 6-8 PM and her funeral Mass will be celebrated at Sacred Heart Church, 260 High Street, Mt. Holly, on Friday, April 25th at 11AM. 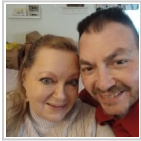
