“ Uncle Alvin, Pops Harold and Uncle Wayne, our deepest prayers and thoughts are with you during this difficult time.

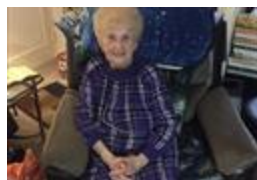
Omi or most of us would call her Mrs Mount Holly, you are missed. You are the Legacy of the Biggs Family. The mold has been broken with your departure.
