September 22, 1927 - September 27, 2012

Jim V. Lullio of Mount Holly died Thursday, Sept. 27, 2012 surrounded by his family. He was 85.

Mr. Lullio was born in New Rochelle, N.Y. and had lived in Mount Holly for over 55 years.

He was a retired First Sergeant in the U.S. Army, serving during World War II, Korea and Vietnam. He was a recipient of the Bronze Star for Valor.

For many years, he was the starter and manager at Fountain Green Golf Course at Fort Dix.

Jim was a member and usher at Sacred Heart Church in Mount Holly.

After his military career, he founded American Training Services, a company which taught inmates heavy equipment operation and then found them work and jobs.

Mr. Lullio's wife, Erma, died in 2005 after 51 years of marriage.

He is survived by two children, Joanne Morris (John) of Westampton and Vincent Lullio (Rachel) of Morganville, N.J. He is also survived by four

grandchildren, John Morris Jr., Rececca Lullio, Julianne Morris and JamieAnn Morris.

Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at 11 a.m. on Tuesday at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, High St. and Bartram Ave., Mount Holly. Interment will be in Brig. Gen. Wm. Doyle Veterans Memorial Cemetery. Friends may call from 7 to 9 p.m. Monday and from 10 to 10:30 a.m. Tuesday at Perinchief Chapels, 438 High St., Mount Holly.
