John Malcolm Peterson of Southampton passed away on September 9, 2015. He was 90. Born in Linden, NJ, Mr. Peterson graduated from the US Merchant Marine Academy at Kingspoint and served in the US Merchant Marines in World War II and in the US Navy during the Korean War. He worked at the Exxon Bayway Refinery as an engineer until his retirement. After the passage of his wife, Janice G.L. Peterson, he moved to South Jersey and resided in Southampton and Tuckerton. He remained active in the US Coast Guard Auxiliary and enjoyed sailing with his grandchildren.
