John F. "Jack" Verner, 75, passed away on April 1, 2025, in Lumberton, New Jersey. A proud veteran and devoted family man, Jack's life was marked by service, strength, and a deep love for his country and those closest to him.

Born on September 3, 1949, in Rancocas, New Jersey, Jack began a life journey that would be defined by courage and commitment. In 1967, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and served for four years with distinction through two and a half tours in the Vietnam War. His dedication to military service continued when he joined the New Jersey Air National Guard in 1981. Serving with the 108th Fighter Wing and later the 108th Air Refueling Wing, Jack rose to the rank of Senior Master Sergeant before retiring in 2008. He also served as an Honor Guard and participated in Operations Noble Eagle and Enduring Freedom—further testament to his unwavering patriotism.

Jack's military career earned him numerous decorations and the respect of all who served alongside him. Yet beyond his uniform, he was known for his wit, humor, loyalty, and boundless love for his family.

He is survived by his devoted wife Patricia Verner; daughter Jennifer Tenner and her husband Kristopher; grandchildren Alyssa Tenner, Ryan Tenner, and Addison Tenner; son Keith Verner; stepchildren Wayne Moyer and Christina Moyer; grandchildren Gabriella Milligan and Chase Milligan; sisters Susan

Evans and Sandra Verner; brother-in-law Dave Evans; and nephew Michael Evans.

Jack was predeceased by his parents Florence and Elmer Verner, as well as his son Byron Verner.

Outside of his military service, Jack found joy in simple pleasures. He was an avid gardener who took pride in nurturing life from the soil. He enjoyed hunting trips and surf fishing along the coastlines he loved so much. The beach was one of his favorite places, a setting where he could relax with family or reflect quietly on life. A true history buff, Jack could often be found watching the History Channel or immersing himself in old war movies that echoed chapters of his own past.

A visitation will be held on Monday, April 21, 2025, from 11:00 AM to 12:00 PM at Perinchief Chapels located at 438 High Street in Mt. Holly, New Jersey (08060). A memorial service will follow at noon at the same location. Committal with full military honors will take place at Brigadier General William C.
