



## Joseph V. Diamond

Joseph (Joe) V. Diamond of Mount Holly, entered into rest on March 21, 2022, at Samaritan Hospice in Mount Holly. He was 92 years old. He was the husband of the late Frances Jane (Toy) Diamond and the late Harriet (Jacobs) Diamond.
