Joseph A. Jones passed away Sunday, August 24, 2014. He was 88. Joe left this world surrounded by his loving family in the Hainesport home that he built with his own hands in 1955.

Joe grew up in Mount Holly, where he attended Rancocas Valley Regional High School before being drafted to serve in the U.S. Army 87th Infantry Division in World War II.

He fought at the Battle of the Bulge, where he was captured and became a Prisoner of War in Limburg Germany. Remarkably, he was liberated by General Patton's Third Army in March 1945.

When Joe returned from the war, he married his high school sweetheart, Mary Lou. Together, they celebrated 57 years of marriage during which they were blessed to raise three children, Gary, Glenalee, and Patrick.

Joe was an ambitious self-taught bricklayer and carpenter who went on to become a successful masonry contractor. As the owner of Jones Masonry, his career was spent building many beautiful homes and commercial buildings throughout the region. He was proud to be a member of the Bricklayers Local 5 of Bordentown.

An avid hunter, Joe enjoyed spending time goose and duck hunting with his buddies in Maryland. He also loved fishing on the Delaware Bay. During the summer, Joe enjoyed spending time with the family at his in-law's shore home in West Wildwood.

While Joe may be gone, we are comforted to know that we are sure to drive past his sturdy and well-built brick creations, which will remind us of this strong man in our lives.
