Joseph F. "Snuffy" Dries passed away at the NJ Veterans Memorial Home in Vineland. He was 90. Joe was born and raised in Mt. Holly, graduating from RVRHS and was recognized as the outstanding Athlete of 1938. Joe was a US Navy Veteran of 30 years serving in World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. Joe received numerous commendations and awards during his military service career. Joe went on to serve his country as a purchasing agent and specification writer for the US Department of Defense Logistics. Predeceased by his loving wife of 61 years Anne Marie (nee Opolka), his parents John J. & Katherine Dries (nee Moncorn); a brother, John Dries; and two sisters, Margaret Anderson & Marie Goley.
