Joseph H. Fort of Pemberton died Thursday, Oct. 6, 2011. He was 87.

The son of the late Maurice and Sara Fort, Mr. Fort was a U.S. Navy Veteran of World War II and was retired from the N.J. Department of Transportation after 37 years as a Foreman for the Highway Department.

He was a member of the Pemberton United Methodist Church and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows Lodge 49 of Pemberton.

Mr. Fort was a longtime member of Good Will Fire Co. 1 of Pemberton for 70 years, serving as Fire Chief, President, Trustee and Fire Police Captain.

He was a Charter member of the Good Will Fire Co. Exempt Association and Life Member of the New Jersey State Firefighter's Association.

He was a member of the Pemberton First United Methodist Church since 1934.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Evelyn; his son, David; his brothers: Maurice and Kenneth; and sister, Betty Hopkins.

He is survived by a daughter and son-in-law, Bonnie and Joseph Haines of Pemberton; grandsons, Jason and Kenneth Haines and Justin and Christopher Fort; three great-grandchildren; a sister, Doris Croshaw; a brother, Donald Fort and his wife, Beverlee; several nieces and nephews, and many dear friends.
