Kathleen Anna Easlick Regn aka “Binnie,” died peacefully on Saturday, October 8, 2016 surrounded by family at her home in Mount Holly due to natural causes. She was just four weeks shy of her 89th birthday.

A lifelong Mount Holly resident, Kathleen graduated from Mount Holly High in 1945. She had worked as a school secretary at the Folwell School in Mount Holly for 17 years. Binnie played in several Canasta “Card Clubs,” she was a genealogist, seamstress, photographer, documentarian, she always compiled sign-in books for every occasion such as 4th of July, Halloween, Bell Ringing’s, Class Reunions and every celebrator occasion the family had. She was a Girl Scout leader for many years and she also known for her number birthday cake with homemade fudge icing. Binnie was member of the Col. Thomas Reynolds Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, she was the First Daughter of Distinction in the New Jersey DAR. She held every position of the Col. Thomas Reynolds Chapter, she was nationally recognized for her Constitution Week Celebration which spanned 25 years. She was a member of the Ex-Reagents, Colonial Dames 17th Century, Peachfield Dames, Cameo Society and also Red Hat “Ruby Chicks of Mount Holly.”

She is survived by her husband of 69 years to John H. Regn; her children: Cyndie, Mark (Kathleen), Marsha, Claudia and Michelle and 10 grandchildren Lauren (Craig), Jonathan (Kristine), Matthew (Jennifer), Stephanie, Melinda,

Christina (Cody), Christopher (Jessica), Jennifer (Bobby), Erik, Danielle and 15 great grandchildren with 1 on the way and her sister, Jessie Alexander of Arizona, brother in-law Russell (Rosemarie) and sister-in law Florence as well as several cousins, nieces and nephews.
