Kenneth Smith of Mount Holly died Wednesday, Sept. 26, 2012 at his home. He was 83.

Born in Mount Holly, Mr. Smith was a lifelong area resident.

He was a 1947 graduate of Rancocas Valley Regional School, where he was a three sport athlete and was a member of the RV Athletic Hall of Fame.
