May 7, 1921 - August 3, 2009

Kenneth E. Street of Hainesport died Monday, August 3, 2009 at Virtua-Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 88. Born in Hainesport, Mr. Street was a lifelong Hainesport Resident. He was a graduate of Mt. Holly High School and was an Army Air Corps Veteran of WW II. Mr. Street gave a lifetime of Community Service. He served 36 years on the Hainesport Township Committee and 21 years as the mayor of Hainesport. He was also the former Clerk of the Burlington County Board of Freeholders; and the former head of the Burlington County Highway Department. Mr. Street was a Life Member of the Hainesport Fire Company, a member of the NJ League of Municipalities, and was a longtime member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Hainesport. Mr. Street was a member of Pemberton Lodge #199 F & AM, Excelsior Consistory, Collingswood, Crescent Temple Shrine, and VFW Post #2692, Mount Holly.

He is survived by his daughter and son-in-law: Susan C. & N. Fred Weber of Cherry Hill; 2 granddaughters: Sherri (Jeff) Schrock and Stacey (Michael) McLaughlin; 4 greatgrandsons: Jared Schrock, Ryan McLaughlin, Brett McLaughlin, and Chase McLaughlin. He is also survived by his good friend Dorothy Eaton. He was the brother of the late Donald Street.
