Kenneth W. Hofbauer, PhD, of Eastampton passed away Saturday, July 13, 2013 at Pennsylvania Presbyterian Hospital in Philadelphia. He was 49. A lifelong area resident, Ken was a Health & Safety Engineer for Prysmian Cables & Systems. He received his undergraduate degree from Earlham College, his master's degree from Century University, and his doctorate from Kings College.

Along with his work and family, Ken was also extremely active and dedicated to the local Fire and EMS services. He was Assistant Chief for the Eastampton Fire-Rescue Dept., Chief of the Burlington County Hazmat Team, Past President and Captain of the Willingboro EMS, a 14 year member of the Willingboro Fire Department, OEM Coordinator for Eastampton Twp., and Instructor for both the Burlington County Fire and EMS Academies.

Ken is survived by his wife Suzanne, son Samuel, sister Sandy Proctor, parents LeVerne and Berwyn Crook, his dogs Billy and Charm and horse Buster.
