Later the Houses attended Shady Rest in Chesterfield and eventually the (former) Hope Conservative Baptist Church in East Windsor. Larry responded to the call to serve on the pastoral ministry team at New Jerusalem, which became Celebration Community Church now meeting in Bordentown Township. Yes, we praise the Lord for Larry and his family and his integrity as a business man, along with his faith in Christ and his faithfulness to the Gospel.
