Leona Sandbloom of Lumberton died Friday December 4th at the Virtua Mount Holly Rehab Center where she had resided for the last seven years. She was 94. Mrs. Sandbloom was born in Chicago Heights, Ill., the daughter of Swedish immigrants, Hjalmar and Alfreda Carlson Woodman. She married Arthur Sandbloom in 1935 and they moved to Puerto la Cruz, Venezuela in 1949 where they lived for 20 years because of his job with Texaco. In 1969 they moved to West Deptford, NJ. Her husband, Arthur died in 1992. Mrs. Sandbloom was artistically talented and was well known for making figurines for Nativity scenes. Leona loved jewelry, having her hair done and being treated like a lady. She also loved Christmastime and was known to many as "Lady Christmas".

Mrs. Sandbloom is survived by her daughter and son-in-law Pat and Ben Grovatt of Tabernacle, a granddaughter, Amy and her husband Tim Brewin and their two sons Matthew and Andrew of Indian Mills, her adopted grandson Simon Chao of Boston, MA and several nieces and nephews
