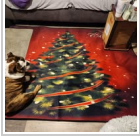
Remembering Loretta. She was a sweet kind caring person and good friend.

The year my Mom passed we came to New Jersey, of course, to see them but just to have a little time away from what we had just faced. It was Christmas Eve and we meant them at a local Dinner to eat with them, Lorretta spoke up and said what will you all do for Christmas Dinner, I told her we would find someplace open, or maybe the motel would be serving for Christmas. That we would see them the day after, Lorretta said to come to our home for dinner, I told her we could not impose on her like that, there was five of us and she had already cooked for her and Uncle Newton, this was after seven and the stores were closed. So she insisted and we went there for Christmas Day the spread of food she had for us was like she knew we were planning on coming there for Christmas and they had no idea we would be in New Jersey over Christmas. I already thought a lot of Loretta for how good she was to my Uncle but that dinner sealed the deal with all of us, she made our Christmas special during a time we were lost, looking for a place to find comfort and that is exactly what she delivered to each of us.

I never had the opportunity to meet her children in person, but I do know that she loved them with all her heart and her grandchildren. I was lucky enough to have met her sister Alice and her husband a couple of times and they were just like Lorretta just wonderful folks.
