Lottie Elise Dunbar died on December 2, 2010 at the NJ Veteran's Memorial Home in Vineland. She was 89.

Lottie was born on July 26, 1921, in Aachen, Germany, to Carlheintz and Gertude Bucholtz.

She met her husband Carson Dunbar in Germany where he served in the U.S. Army, and eventually relocated to the U.S. After her husband's retirement from the U.S. Army, their four children were raised in the Holly Hills section of Westampton Twp., New Jersey. After raising her own children she lovingly raised and supported her two grandchildren Carla and Eric, as if they were her own.

She also took pleasure in helping people, which is a characteristic she passed down throughout her lineage.

Lottie is survived by her sons, George and Carson J. Dunbar, Jr.; 12 grandchildren, and 8 great grandchildren, including Ciara, for whom she held

a special place in her heart. She is also survived by seven siblings: Anita Thonassen, Agnes Williams, Mathilde Bolz, Marinne Samos, Gerta Ali, Heinz Bucholz and Walter Bucholz.

She was preceded in death by her mother and father, her loving husband Carson Dunbar and her beloved daughters Shirley Dunbar and Gloria Maddred.
